	Zoning is residential single-family and A, S, or SA.
	The lot size is 11,800 sf. or greater.
	Number of chickens allowed based on lot size: Sf./4,356 = No. of chickens allowed. 	Chickens shall be confined in a coop enclosed on all sides including from top.
	The coop shall be located within the rear yard, 20' feet from the dwelling and 10' ft. from side and rear lot lines.
	Prohibited coop materials: Tarps, plastic, fabric, rubber, paper, cardboard, or other non-traditional building materials.
	The coop shall not exceed 80 sf. or 8' ft. in height.
	The coop shall be screened from adjacent properties with evergreens, privacy fence, or wall.
	The keeping of chickens shall follow local, state, and federal regulations.
	Roosters are prohibited.

SITE PLAN *required*

Attach a scaled site plan showing boundaries, traffic circulation, anchoring method for temporary structures, seating, parking, waste disposal, location of mobile food vending, and dimensional setbacks.

Mobile food vending is permitted in all zoning districts, subject to the following requirements:

- a. Each individual mobile food vendor must obtain a license from the clerk's office prior to operation within city limits.
- b. Zoning Permit shall be approved prior to mobile food vending.
- c. Mobile food vendors may not park overnight at any vending location.
- d. A 12'-foot one-way aisle where one-way vehicle circulation is required must be maintained around mobile food vending.
- e. A 26'-foot two-way aisle where two-way vehicle circulation is required must be maintained around mobile food vending.
- f. Mobile food vending may not impede the use of a minimum number of parking spaces based on the site's parking demand according to section 12.02 of Chapter 94.
- g. Mobile food vending must be setback 10' from any building.
- h. No alcoholic beverage may be sold via mobile food vending – unless this alcohol service part of an otherwise permitted even such as a temporary outdoor event in a commercial district or outdoor festivals, fairs, carnivals, craft show, athletic tournaments and events, concerts, farmer's markets, auto shows permitted in the P-SP-Public/Semi Public zoning district or as permitted by Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs and/or the Michigan Liquor Control Commission.
- i. All mobile food vending must comply with the City of Walker noise ordinance.
- j. No mobile food vendor may be located within 200 feet of an open brick-and-mortar restaurant unless the restaurant or the restaurant's property owner gives written permission.

ZONING

C-1 C-2 CPUD I-2 I-1 ORP

PROHIBITION ON SALES OF OTHER ITEMS

No items other than produce or eggs shall be displayed or sold at a roadside stand permitted under this section.

“Produce” shall mean fresh fruits, vegetables, baked goods, and similar food products provided for direct sale to retail customers. The term “produce” shall not include flowers or any other plants or plant materials (except fresh fruits and vegetables as provided herein). Eggs shall mean eggs that are produced on the property on which they are sold, and in conjunction with an approved backyard chickens permit per section 15.07.B.

Parking areas shall have a dustless and durable surface.

HOURS OF USE

Limited to 8 AM to 11 PM

PARKING

Attach a site plan to demonstrate compliance with Section 12.02 and a signed agreement for offsite parking if necessary.

SECURITY & SANITATION

Adequate security shall be provided to protect the public health and safety including private security guards and limited access points. Adequate facilities shall be provided on the premises for the proper disposal of waste.
